THE AWARD:

The Asia Society's "Asia 21 Young Leaders Initiative" brings together dynamic young leaders from across the Asia-Pacific region and the United States. Asia 21 Class of 2012 Fellows, a core group of leaders from the Asia Society, are pleased to announce the launch of the Asia 21 Young Leaders Initiative 2012 Public Service Award (PSA). The award recognizes an organization that serves underprivileged social and economic groups, communities and the public in the Asia-Pacific region.

The goals of the Public Service Award are as follows:

- (a) Recognize the achievements of a small to medium-sized organization engaged in public service in the Asia-Pacific region
- (b) Provide a grant to support the activities of the organization
- (c) Provide ongoing support for the organization through the assistance of the 2012 Asia 21 Class of Fellows
- (d) Replicate successful activities of the organization in other countries

The Award consists of US\$10,000 along with the continued active support of the Asia 21 Class of 2012 Fellows in providing the selected public service organization with access to the Fellows' network for program development as well as in helping to replicate the models of successful projects. This additional in-kind aid will help position the award-winning organization with the tools to expand to a higher level of service and to other regions around Asia.

SELECTION CRITERIA FOR ORGANIZATIONS:

An organization should meet the following eligibility criteria:

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA

All organizations applying for this award must:

- be nominated by an Asia 21 Fellow or Delegate of a past Asia 21 Young Leaders' Summit
- be based in the Asia-Pacific region and conduct activities in the Asia-Pacific region
- be willing to accept ongoing support from the Asia 21 Class of 2012 Fellows
- gain permission to accept funds from the United States of America
- demonstrate positive impact from their work at the time of submission of their application
- have an annual budget of less than US\$ 3 million
- have a transparent accounting process for finances

DESIRABLE CRITERIA

It is highly desirable that a successful organization:

- conduct work that is innovative and sustainable over the long-term
- conduct work with specific and measurable impact that can be tracked over time
- have a clear mission statement and focus
- conduct work that meets the needs of a specific underprivileged group or community
- conduct work that has the potential to grow and be extended to other countries in the Asia-Pacific region

Award Selection Committee:

The Award Selection Committee will consist of the Asia 21 Class of 2012 Fellows and the Asia Society, with technical support from additional organizational partners.



TIMELINE AND KEY STEPS



July 19 - September 3, 2012:

Call for nominations

All proposals for the Asia 21 2012 PSA should be submitted by email to the Jury Administrator.

October 1 – November 1, 2012:

Final selection process by Asia 21 Fellows

September 3, 2012:

Closing date for applications

November 1, 2012:

Winner of the PSA notified All unsuccessful applicants will be notified by email before 18th October

2012.

September 3 – October 1, 2012:

Review of proposals and the selection of top five organizations

Proposals will be reviewed against the selection criteria mentioned on the previous page. The top five organizations will be duly published on the Asia Society website on September 13.

December 7-9, 2012:

Award Ceremony

Asia 21 2012 PSA Presentation Ceremony at the Asia Society's 2012 Asia 21 Young Leaders Summit in Dhaka, Bangladesh.

NOMINATION PROCEDURES:

Current and previous Asia 21 Young Leaders (including both Delegates and Fellows) are invited to nominate one or more organizations for the Asia 21 2012 Public Service Award. The organization should complete the following application form, including the name and year of the Asia 21 Delegate or Fellow.

The application, including the documents described on the following page, should be submitted by email **as a single PDF document.** All nominations should be submitted in English.

NOMINATION DEADLINE:

Completed nomination, application forms and required information therein must be submitted by 12:00 Midnight, ET on September 3, 2012.

- 4. Additional information that supports your application (such as press releases, reports or other data relating to projects mentioned in your application). The additional information should be a maximum of 5 pages. This is not essential to your application. We may request additional information during the review process.

Nominations for the 2012 Public Service Award should be submitted **by email only**. Please scan these documents and include them all in a <u>single PDF document</u>. Please endeavor to keep the PDF file to a maximum size of 10MB. You can merge a number of separate PDF documents by using various programs available free on-line.
